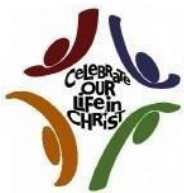

SUMMER FOOD PANTRY NEEDS

We continue to struggle to obtain the food we need through the Northern Illinois Food Bank. IC DAYBREAK TRANSITIONAL HOUSING

GOOD USED CAR DONATIONS NEEDED

IC Daybreak Transitional Housing partners with Bridge Communities, who provides numerous resources for our client families, which often include educational classes in nutrition, parenting, resume-building, office skills and more. One of the program requirements is that a client is employed full-time. One of the most significant barriers to finding and keeping employment is unreliable transportation. Many clients enter our program with either no car or a car that needs extensive and costly repairs. Bridge relies on donations to provide cars to these families. Reliable transportation is a necessity, as public transportation in DuPage County is limited. One of our current clients is currently in need of a good used vehicle. 2023 Midyear Activity Report

The caring people of Elmhurst unite to provide compassionate assistance to people in need in our community.

The number of requests for EWAN assistance this year has reached a record high. Through the end of June, client visits to our purple door totaled **514**, a **16% increase** over last year's **443** count. As for the total of client services provided, the current year-to-date number is **738**, up from **608** in 2022, for a **21.4% increase**. Concerning the dollar value of those services, our midyear number of **\$101,447** is a **40.2% increase** from **\$72,383** in 2022.

No matter the cause, it's clear that the need for EWAN's help to our less fortunate neighbors is greater than ever.

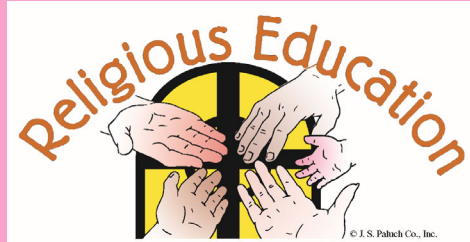



Saints' Devotion to the Eucharist

St. John Vianney's Devotion to the Eucharist – Feast Day August 4

The devotion to prayer of St. John M. Vianney, who was to spend almost the whole of the last thirty years of his life in Church caring for the crowds of penitents who flocked to him, had one special characteristic—it was specially directed toward the Eucharist.

It is almost unbelievable how ardent his devotion to Christ hidden beneath the veils of the Eucharist really was. "He is the one"—he said—"Who has loved us so much; why shouldn't we love Him in return?" He was devoted to the adorable Sacrament of the altar with a burning charity and his soul was drawn to the sacred Tabernacle by a heavenly force that could not be resisted.

This is how he taught his faithful to pray: "You do not need many words when you pray. We believe on faith that the good and gracious God is there in the tabernacle; we open our souls to Him; and feel happy that He allows us to come before Him; this is the best way to pray." He did everything that there was to be done to stir up the reverence and love of the faithful for Christ hidden in the Sacrament of the Eucharist and to bring them to share in the riches of the divine Synaxis; the example of his devotion was ever before them. "To be convinced of this—witnesses tell us—all that was necessary was to see him carrying out the sacred ceremonies or simply to see him genuflect when he passed the tabernacle." POPE JOHN XXIII

Below is a short prayer attributed to St. John Vianney that is simple yet profound. It is to be said before receiving Holy Communion, and asks Jesus to dwell within us. It expresses the truth that God is coming to us in the Eucharist and that he desires to dwell within us, just as we desire to dwell within him.

O my God, come to me, so that You may dwell in me and I may dwell in you.

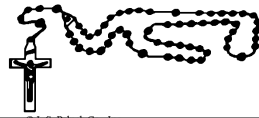

If you are the same at the end of Mass as you were at the beginning, something is wrong. The Eucharist is the presence of Jesus, it is deeply transforming. Jesus comes and must transform you. In the Eucharist, it is Christ who offers Himself, who gives Himself for us. He invites us, so that our lives may be nourished by Him and may nourish the lives of our brothers and sisters. The Eucharistic Celebration is an encounter with the Risen Jesus. At the same time, it is a way of opening ourselves to the world as He taught us. Each time we participate in the Eucharist, Jesus comes and gives us the strength to love like He loved, because it gives us the courage to encounter others, to go out of ourselves, and to open ourselves to others with love. Let us pray that Catholics place at the center of their lives the Eucharistic Celebration, which transforms human relationships and opens up an encounter with God and their brothers and sisters.

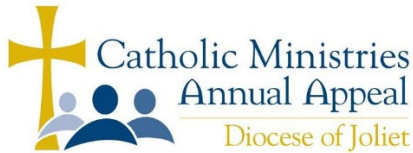

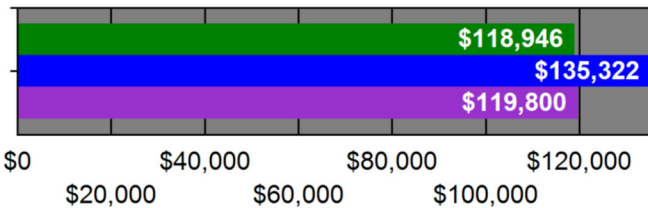
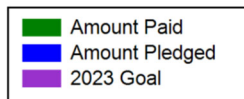
