

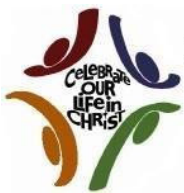

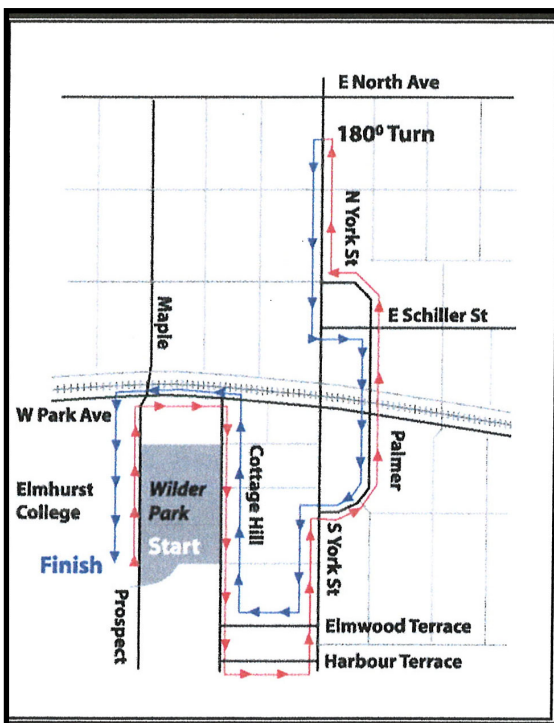
The 2024 Mass book is now open.

Sr. Mary Francis Werner met the School Sisters of St. Francis of Christ the King when they moved into her neighborhood in Greenfield, Wisconsin. Already active in the parish, she admired the Sisters and helped them during her high school years.

Following graduation, she entered the community and began college, hoping to do social work. However, her life took a different direction when she began her ministry teaching grade school and then high school religion at Mt. Assisi Academy. In 1997, she was appointed principal of the Academy, a position she held until the Academy closed in 2014.

Sr. Mary Francis ministers full time as Director of Religious Education K-5 here at Immaculate Conception in Elmhurst. She does tremendous work with both our grade school and our religious education children. She will be honored this weekend at the St. Francis of Christ the King Jubilee Celebration. 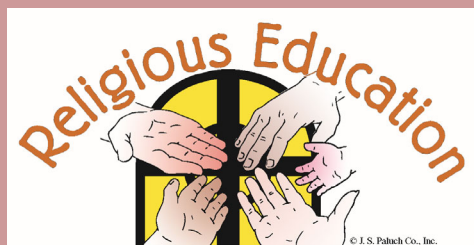

Eucharistic Revival



The Real presence of the Eucharist

The second theme we will focus on in this second year of the three year Eucharist Revival is the 'Real Presence of the Eucharist'.

The Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life. The term "Eucharist" originates from the Greek word *eucharistia*, meaning thanksgiving. In the celebration of the Eucharist, bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit and the instrumentality of the priest. The whole Christ is truly present -- body, blood, soul, and divinity -- under the appearances of bread and wine, the glorified Christ who rose from the dead. This is what the Church means when speaking of the "Real Presence" of Christ in the Eucharist.

Jesus gives himself to us in the Eucharist as spiritual nourishment because he loves us. By eating the Body and drinking the Blood of Christ in the Eucharist, we become united to the person of Christ through his humanity. "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him" (Jn 6:56). In being united to the humanity of Christ, we at the same time are united to his divinity. Our mortal and corruptible natures are transformed by being joined to the source of life.

The transformed bread and wine are **truly** the Body and Blood of Christ and are not merely symbols. When Christ said "This is my body" and "This is my blood," the bread and wine are transubstantiated. Though the bread and wine appear the same to our human senses, they are actually the real body and blood of Jesus. The Church teaches that Christ remains present under the appearances of bread and wine as long as the appearances of bread and wine remain.

As St. Pope John Paul II wrote - Receiving the Eucharist means entering into a profound communion with Jesus. 'Abide in me, and I in you' (Jn 15:4). This relationship of profound and mutual 'abiding' enables us to have a certain foretaste of heaven on earth. Eucharistic communion was given so that we might be in union with God here on earth, in expectation of our complete fulfillment in heaven."

In the Eucharist the Church both receives the gift of Jesus Christ and gives grateful thanks to God for such a blessing. This thanksgiving is the only proper response, for through this gift of himself in the celebration of the Eucharist, under the appearances of bread and wine, Christ gives us the gift of eternal life.

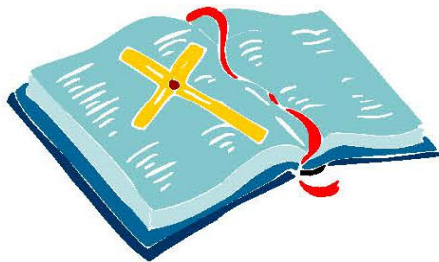

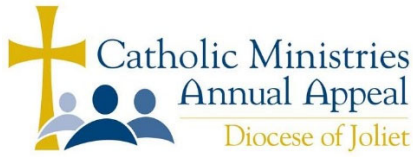

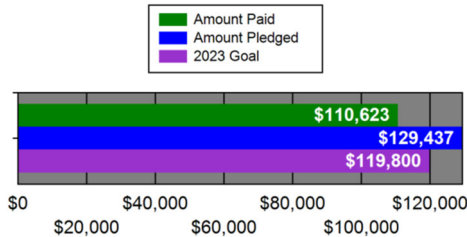
