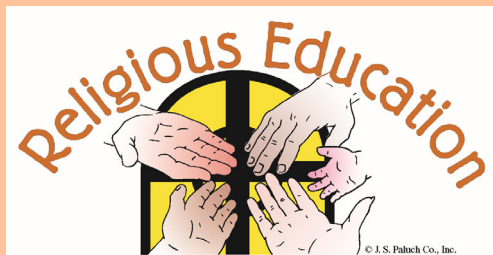
The Feast of Pentecost – Mission and Evangelization
