Eucharistic Revival



St. Thomas Aquinas (1225-74) – Feast Day January 28

Aquinas is known for his unparalleled theology of the Eucharist, especially in his *Summa Theologiae*, as well as his Eucharistic hymns which the Church has adopted in the liturgy, written originally for the establishment of the Feast of Corpus Christi. These include the “Pange Lingua,” sung on Holy Thursday, “Panis Angelicus,” and the hymns used before and after Benediction. He would say Mass each morning and then attend another Mass in thanksgiving. He also composed prayers to be said before and after Mass. FOOD PANTRY NEEDS

We continue to struggle to obtain the food we need through the Northern Illinois Food Bank. The following items are most needed and requested in our pantry right now: cereal, pancake mix, pasta and pasta sauce, milk, canned fruit and vegetables, full-size condiments, salad dressing, toothpaste, body soap/wash, shampoo, personal hygiene products, laundry detergent, paper towels, and dish soap. Items may be dropped off

during our pantry hours, 10-noon M-TH, or during normal business hours at the rectory. Fresh produce from your summer gardens would also be most appreciated! Fresh produce is in short supply through the Northern Illinois Food Bank. If you have an abundance of tomatoes, corn, squash, berries or other home-grown goodies, our clients would love to have some! Thank you!

GOOD USED CAR DONATIONS NEEDED

IC Daybreak Transitional Housing partners with Bridge Communities, in our transitional housing ministry. Program requirements specify that a potential client be employed full-time. A significant barrier to finding and keeping employment is unreliable transportation. Many clients enter our program without a car or have a car that needs extensive and costly repairs. Bridge relies on donations to provide cars to these families.

Reliable transportation is a necessity, as public transportation in DuPage County is limited. One of our current clients is currently in need of a good used vehicle.

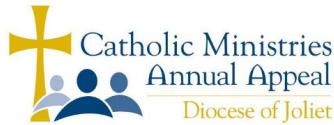

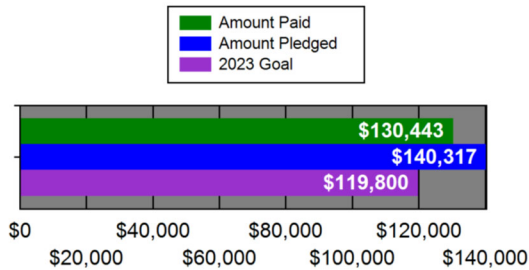
