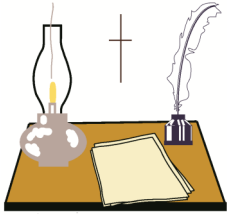

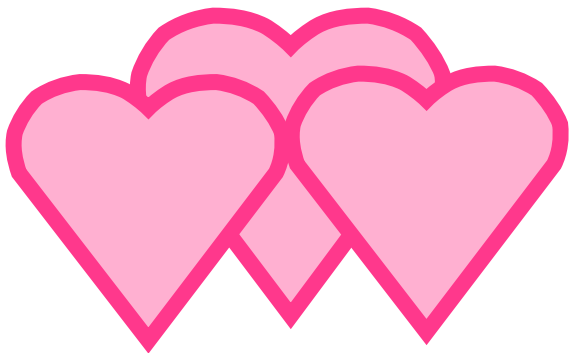

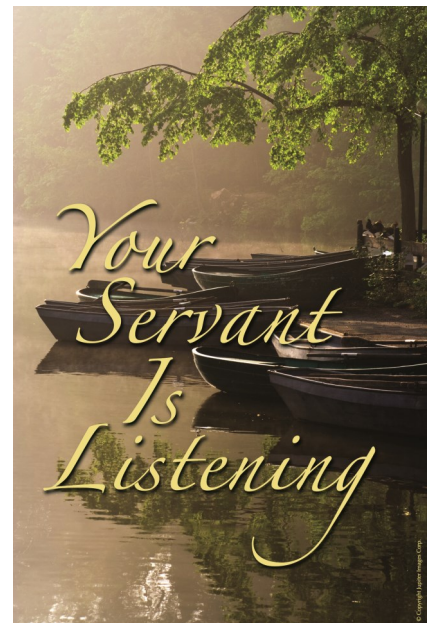

HOSPITALIZED or HOMEBOUND? PLEASE LET US KNOW!

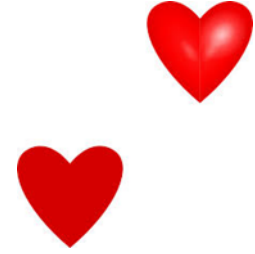

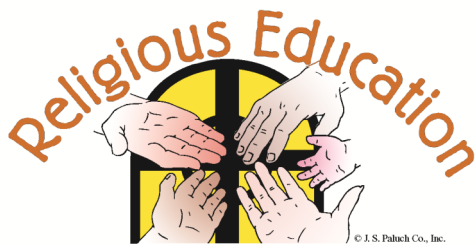


Reporting Sexual Abuse


