O compassionate St. Blaise, if it is agreeable to Our Heavenly Father, obtain a cure for my ills.

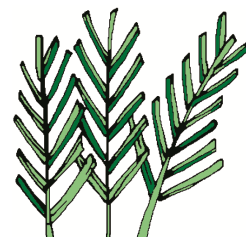

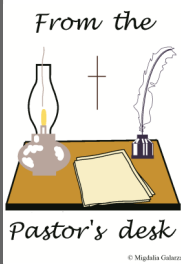

Dear Friends in Christ,


So far we have been blessed with a relatively mild winter. It is still early in the season and we have a long way to go before it's over. Hopefully, we'll miss the terrible winter cold we experienced last year. Hopefully, we will also not have to deal with any extreme blizzard conditions. The Holy Season of Lent does not begin until February 26th. The season of Ordinary Time will last until then.

Thank you so very much for your continued generosity both to our parish and to our We Are IC! Capital Campaign. It is still our hope to continue to work on the chapel in May of this year. Our ability to do so depends upon reaching the financial goals for building projects set by the diocese. On October 20, 2019, we shared with you a financial update of the work that has been accomplished thus far. We will soon be enjoying the use of our new elevator in the Parish Center. The new windows along with the new doors have been a welcomed addition. In a little bit more than three months, we have received nearly \$400,000 in donations and pledges. Gifts of all amounts will help us to move forward. Some of you made a one-time gift last year. Please consider doing so once again as it will help a great deal. Likewise, there are several memorials still available. Another set of our stained glass windows will be installed soon. The families that have donated towards the windows that have been installed have spiritually benefitted from them. There are other windows that have been donated and will be made according to the artist's schedule. Recently, we have posted the availability of memorial pew donations. On a regular basis, people are coming forward requesting either a whole or partial pew. Donations for the pews, like all memorials may be paid over a period of time.

Above all, please continue to keep the renewal of Sacred Heart Chapel in your prayers. Not only will the chapel be a more enhanced place for us to celebrate Mass and the sacraments, but also may it be a source of veneration for the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Dear Brothers and Sisters,

The winter season certainly reminds us that life needs moments of quietness, reflection, and internal preparation also that nature is constantly moving, transforming and renewing. Just as our environment is transforming, so we too. However, we can change for the better not only physically but also spiritually. So, in this month of February, I would like to reflect on the Apostolic Letter "*Aperuit Illis*" of Pope Francis regarding the necessity of meditating the Word of God on a daily basis. The Apostolic Letter of Pope Francis in the form of *Motu Proprio* starts saying: "**He opened ("aperuit") their minds to understand the Scriptures** (Lk 24:45)... Without the Lord who opens our minds to them, it is impossible to understand the Scriptures in-depth" This reminds us of the infinite knowledge of the Word of God and its impact in our lives.

On September 30th, 2019 on the feast day of St. Jerome Pope Francis instituted the Sunday of the Word of God. He specifically says, "Third Sunday in Ordinary Time is to be devoted to the celebration, study, and dissemination of the word of God. This *Sunday of the Word of God* will thus be a fitting part of that time of the year when we are encouraged to strengthen our bonds with the Jewish people and to pray for Christian unity. This is more than a temporal coincidence: the celebration of the Sunday of the Word of God has ecumenical value, since the Scriptures point out, for those who listen, the path to authentic and firm unity" Please keep in mind the words of Pope Francis declaring that "sacred Scripture is essential to our identity as Christians." The powerful words indicate that we *cannot* understand completely "the events of the mission of Jesus and his Church in this world," without praying and without studying Sacred Scripture on a deeper level. As Saint Jerome rightly claims: "Ignorance of the Scriptures is ignorance of Christ."

What Pope Francis wants to teach us is that, in the Scriptures, we can find a beautiful dialogue "between the Lord and his people" a dialogue that can enrich us completely. Indeed, the beautiful and meaningful dialogue between God and His people that we find throughout the Bible is a dialogue that can be translated into our own dialogue. Our own lives have to be "constantly marked by this decisive relationship with the living word"

One of the eloquent names that Pope Francis uses to speak about the Bible, which we should think about, is "the book of the Lord's people." This epithet means that the Bible is not just a simple book one we can put inside our night table or in a bookcase. The Bible, says Pope Francis, "belongs above all to those called to hear its message and to recognize themselves in its words... The Bible is the book of the Lord's people, who, in listening to it, move from dispersion and division towards unity. The word of God unites believers and makes them one people." Since it is the *peoples' book*, unity has to be a primary element. Therefore, if we want to live united as God's children, we have to work every day to make the Bible a center of our families. Remember that "a family who prays together stays together," and the Bible provides such unity. Another inspiring assertion by Pope Francis is "The Bible, as sacred Scripture, thus speaks of Christ and proclaims him as the one who had to endure suffering and then enter into his glory. Not simply a part, but the whole of Scripture speaks of Christ." Unfortunately, some people believe that the only place to find Jesus is in the New Testament; however, this is not true. In order to understand the New Testament, we have to turn to the Old Testament. They both, the Old Testament, and New Testament, "speak of Christ: they enable us to believe that his death and resurrection are not a myth but history."

At this point, we have to make a connection between the Bible and faith. "Faith comes from hearing, and what is heard is based on the word of Christ (*Rom 10:17*)," Eventually, faith makes us hear attentively the living word of God and to put it into practice. In sum, it is not enough to hear, as a beautiful story—worthy of Hollywood—the word of God. We have to learn to make that word part of our daily life. Yet another amazing claim by Pope Francis is the "bond between sacred Scripture and the Eucharist." The Second Vatican Council clarifies, "the Church has always venerated the divine Scriptures as she has venerated the Lord's body, in that she never ceases, above all in the sacred liturgy, to partake of the bread of life and to offer it to the faithful from the one table of the word of God and the body of Christ" (*Dei Verbum*, 21).

Thus, the Bible and Eucharist make "possible for us to see ourselves as part of one another." We are not living like islands—adrift in the sea—allowing each one of us to do whatever is best for ourselves. Definitely, not. We are *one body*—the Church—united by the celebration of the Body of the Lord. Once again, the invitation is to be able to embrace, to love and, to value Scripture as a way to have an encounter with the living word of God, specifically in the celebration of the Eucharist. The burden of this argument is that "Sacred Scripture and the sacraments are thus inseparable. When the sacraments are introduced and illumined by God's word, they become ever more clearly the goal of a process whereby Christ opens our minds and hearts to acknowledge his saving work."

Brethren, I wish you the best throughout all your responsibilities and activities in this month of February, and I repeat my thanks to all of you. Equally, I can reassure you of my daily prayers for the success of all your many projects and the well-being of your families.

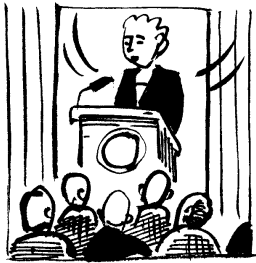

Immaculate Conception Daybreak Transitional Housing for the Homeless Annual Appeal / 2019

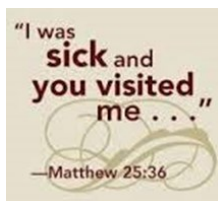

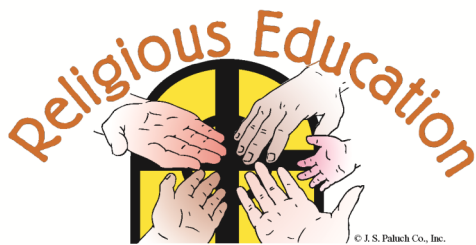

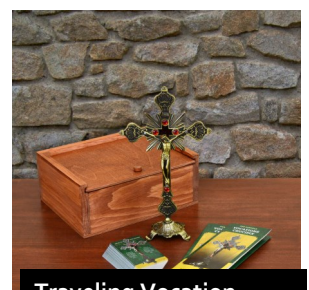
Celebrate “We Are Mundelein” Month Throughout February

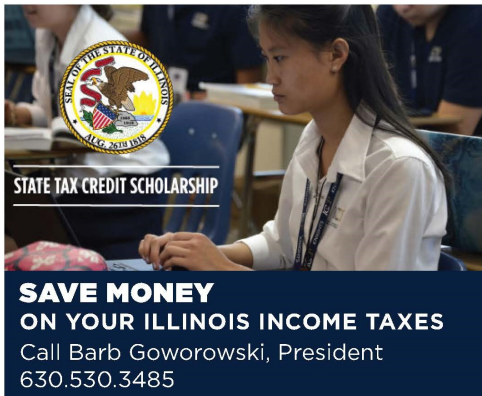

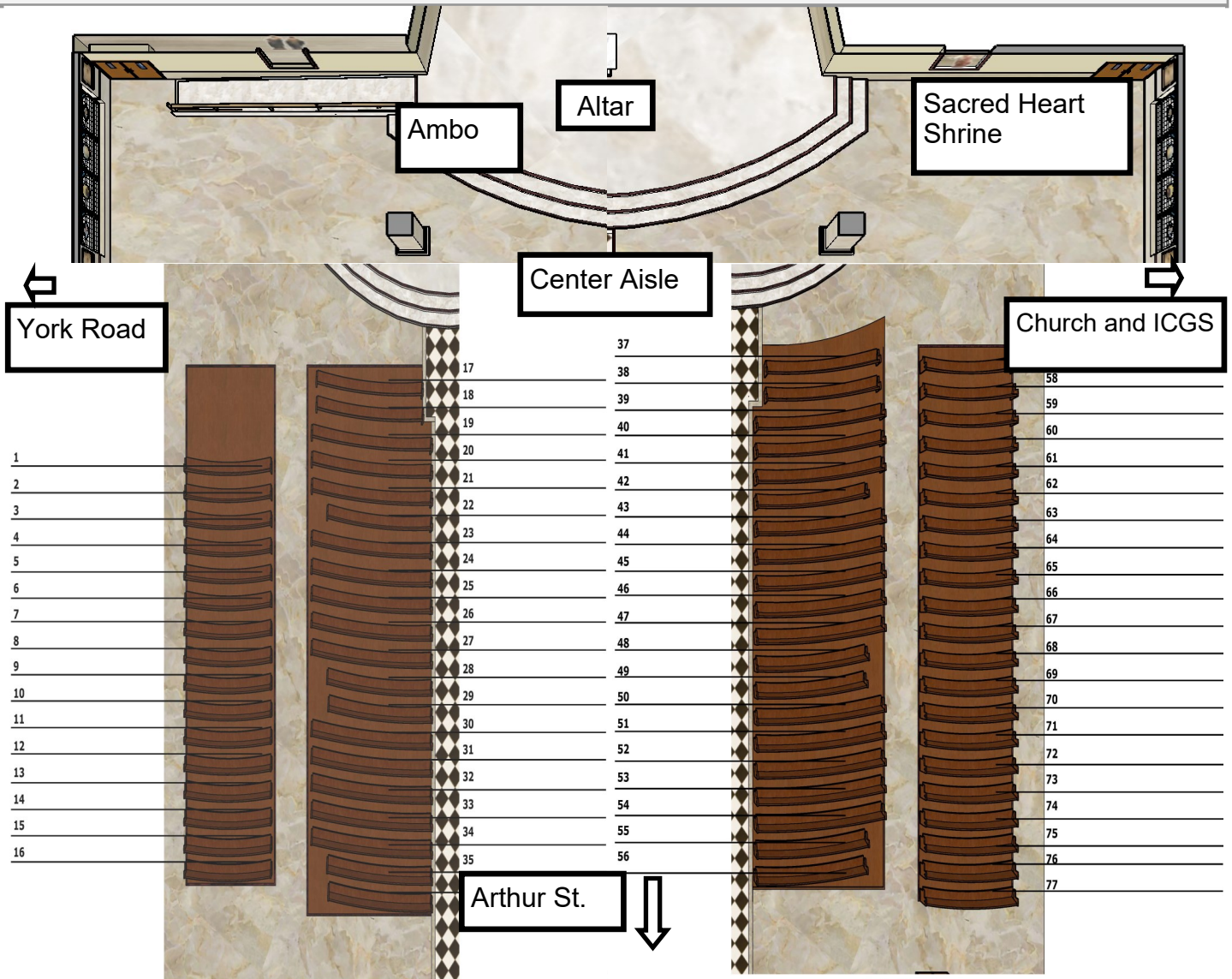
IC Marches in 2020 Chicago March for Life

Stations of the Cross Memorials

In the renewal of our Sacred Heart Chapel, a new set of Stations of the Cross will be used. The beautiful images will be an ever present reminder of Christ's final journey while He was here on earth. They will be made from stone and will relate to the rest of the finishes in the chapel. Opportunities to sponsor the stations still exist. Please consider doing so. Dedicating a particular one of them in memory of a family member or other loved one will create a lasting memorial. Discuss this effort with your families as they may well desire to be part of such an effort.

Many people have special devotion to Mary. In the 4th Station, Jesus meets His mother. Perhaps your wife, mother, or grandmother has passed away and she had a special love for Mary. Having this Station dedicated in her honor will be a way of remembering that bond that exists into eternity. On the way to Calvary, Jesus fell three times. How many times have every one of us fallen and then were helped up by the Lord? Perhaps you have had a crisis in your life when Christ was there for you. He helped you get through it. A memorialized Station of Christ's falls to the ground will serve as a sign of thanks for how He has picked you up.

- I. Jesus is condemned to death.
- II. Jesus is made to bear His cross.
- III. Jesus falls for the first time.
- IV. Jesus encounters His mother, Mary.
- V. Simon of Cyrene is made to carry the cross.
- VI. Veronica wipes the face of Jesus.
- VII. Jesus falls the second time.
- VIII. The women of Jerusalem weep over Jesus.
- IX. Jesus falls the third time.
- X. Jesus is stripped of His garments.
- XI. Jesus is nailed to the cross.
- XII. Jesus dies on the cross
- XIII. Jesus is taken down from the cross.
- XIV. Jesus is placed in the sepulchre.



(The marble to be used for the background of the Stations of the Cross will be taken from the current rear wall of the Sacred Heart Chapel.)
