

Lenten Outreach Project

Almsgiving is one of the three pillars of Lent, along with Prayer and Fasting. Each year, our parish faith community is given the opportunity to help those less fortunate; for the past ten years, our alms have benefited St. Mary's Mission School in Red Lake, MN. Once again, we will donate our alms to the children on the reservation. Our funds will also be used to donate the only stained glass window in the church, directly behind the altar.

St. Mary's Mission School has faced a number of challenges in the ten years that Immaculate Conception has supported them through our Lenten alms, the latest of which was a fire which demolished their worship space. IC has been enormously generous in the past. Father Jerry delighted in our relationship, always telling us to **"never underestimate the good that you do."** During Lent, as we seek to draw closer to God, let us remember God's favor to us and ways in which we might share our favor with our lesser brothers and sisters in Christ.

Our Lenten alms will be collected on Palm Sunday. May God bless you for your ongoing generosity.



Daily Masses

On Fridays when there is a Grade School Mass at 8:15am, masses will be celebrated at 6:15am and 8:15am. On these days there will be no 7:30 am mass. When there is not a grade school mass, masses will be celebrated at 6:15am and 7:30am. Those who regularly attend the 7:30 am mass are encouraged and welcome to participate either in the 6:15 or 8:15am masses when there is not a 7:30 am mass. All are encouraged to attend daily Masses, especially during Lent.

Lenten Regulations

1. Everyone 14 years of age or over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.
2. All from the age of 18 years up to the beginning of their 60th year are bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
3. On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted on these two days, but liquids, including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.
4. To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful.
5. Lent is the principal season of penance in the Church year. All of the faithful are strongly urged to develop and follow a program of voluntary self-denial (in addition to following the Lenten regulations), serious prayer, and a performance of works of charity and mercy.

Those who are sick, pregnant, or nursing, or whose health would adversely be affected by fasting or abstinence, should not consider themselves bound by these norms.

Anointing of the Sick

The Sacrament of the Sick will be available for all in need following 8am Mass on March 18th

Anointing of the Sick is one of two Sacraments of Healing, the other being Reconciliation. Many people think of asking for this anointing only when they are nearing death through sickness or old age. However, if this is the case, we would be missing out on the opportunity for God to heal and help us at times when we might need God the most - when we are having surgery, dealing with a physical, mental, emotional, or even spiritual affliction. It is during these difficult times that we need the Holy Spirit's gifts of strength, faith, peace and courage. It is during these times, as well, that we should seek to receive this God-given Sacrament of Healing. Are any among you sick? They should call for the elders of the church and have them pray over them, anointing them with oil in the name of the Lord. James 5:14




