For most people, these days are amongst the busiest of the year. I encourage you to try not to allow these days to be over extended. Try to remember that Christmas begins on December 25th and continues to be celebrated this year until January 12th. Try above all to not only prepare your home for Christmas, but also your heart. If possible, each day try to find a few additional quiet moments when you can pause and consider the coming of Christ. We live these days in anticipation of His first coming into the world as a child. We are called to remember that the time will come when He will return to the earth. We also celebrate during Advent the many ways in which comes to us every day during our lives.

I certainly encourage you to also receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation in preparation of Christ's coming. Allow the Lord's presence in this sacrament of healing to come upon you abundantly. This year, the priests of our deanery will once again be participating in a 7 hour session for continuous reception of Reconciliation. On December 14th, from 9am to 4pm, in our church, priests will be available throughout this day to hear your confessions. There is no better time to come and receive this gift than on this day. If you have not received confession in a long time, perhaps the Lord is now personally inviting you to come and receive His pardoning peace. Please also let others know that we are making the sacrament available for them to come and receive.

Both Father James and I look forward to the celebration of Christmas. Remember that this is Father James' first Christmas as a priest and this will then be a very special one for him. Know that all of you are remembered daily in our prayers. We will also remember all of you in a special way during the Advent and Christmas Seasons. May the Lord, Jesus bless you abundantly with joy and good health. May the New Year 2020 be the start of another time of continuous blessings for us all and especially you and your loved ones.

Dear Brothers and Sisters: We are initiating a new month, December, that—interestingly enough—is at the exact time we are initiating a new liturgical year. So, as we have the custom of wishing the best in the civil new year, I believe that it is nice to wish the best in this new liturgical year. As is the custom to make various resolutions at the beginning of the civil year, I believe it is very important to make firm resolutions in this new liturgical year. After all, Advent is a time of preparation for enjoying and living the richness of Christmas. So, at this particular time of Advent, I propose we reflect on the virtue of *magnanimity* and make the resolution to work towards this virtue.

Of course, we must first understand what *magnanimity* is. We can say that it is a mixture of noble behavior and thinking, of fairness and generosity. People who display the virtue of magnanimity are those who are seeking to do things of honor. Magnanimity, according to Saint Thomas Aquinas, is a "stretching forth of the mind to great things." Tragically, in today's world, this virtue is consistently forgotten. These days people are not looking to expand their souls, but rather to expand their pockets and increase their profit margins. Certainly, there is nothing wrong with working to increase our capital. What *is* wrong is to focus only and uniquely on those aspects of our lives—or, or even worse, not to help those who are in need. To behave in this way is like being overly concerned about the outside appearance of a car but care very little or nothing about the motor, the engine, or the brakes. Without our full attention, for sure that car is not going to take us very far, and for sure that way of life is not going to bring us fulfillment.

Sadly, so many people in our society today are self-centered. Their selfishness leaves God totally out of the picture. The focus is on what I want, what advantages I can gain, what is needed so that I am great. Slowly but surely, people convince themselves that their "rights" are more important than responsibilities to others. We have forgotten that people's rights are indeed *our* responsibilities and vice versa. We cannot have a coin with only one side.

This attitude of "it's-all-about-me" leads directly to arrogance. Why believe in God when science and technology can answer every question with logic and rationality? Who needs God when we can control and dominate the world with scientific and technological wonders? Indeed, technology is the new god: out with the old and in with the new. Say goodbye to God and say hello to the latest technological device. This is the mantra of so many people in the world today. Striving towards greatness has come to mean striving for the latest-and-greatest products--ones that we choose.

Not surprisingly, a lack of magnanimity has a direct impact on other virtues. For instance, charity—which is defined as the love of God in which we are able to participate and in which we find the ability to love others—is terribly wounded. Another virtue that is greatly affected is hope, which is defined as trust in a positive outcome. Lack of magnanimity, therefore, leads toward despair and away from charity, hope, and the love of God.

As Catholics, we have to seek out the seeking of greatness. To do so, we must become more fully aware of the high calling God has for each of us especially in this time of Advent. This service to others has to be the uppermost in our mind as we prepare ourselves for the celebration of the birth of Jesus. If we cultivate the virtue of magnanimity, then we will be on the path of achieving great deeds, not only for our benefit but also for the well-being and salvation of others. By deepening the virtue of magnanimity within ourselves, we will be willing to move beyond our comfort zone, to make the extra effort, to go the extra mile in order to serve others. In doing so, we are going to achieve plenitude, fulfillment, happiness, and peace because the Son of God is going to dwell in our hearts.

I wish you a happy and meaningful month of December in all your activities and a happy new liturgical year. We ask for the intercession of our Heavenly Mother, the Immaculate Virgin Mary so that we can achieve the virtuous life that corresponds to true children of God. I reiterate my thanks to all of you for your prayers and support, and I assure you of my daily prayers. God bless each one of you.


# **Vocations**

### Immaculate Conception Daybreak Transitional Housing for the Homeless 2019 Annual Appeal

For nearly 30 years, **Immaculate Conception Daybreak of Elmhurst** has rented apartments to house homeless families. This is a self-supporting ministry, funded solely through personal donations.

IC Daybreak commits to pay rent and utilities every

month for the **FIVE** units it provides to those in need. Mentors meet with these families on a weekly basis to teach budgeting and life skills. Families transition out of these apartments within a two-year period. Since inception, **IC** Daybreak has helped 80 families transition from homelessness to self-sufficiency.

We have recently added a new family to our program and two families will transition out in May, 2020. It is a privilege to work with those who want to change their lives. participating in our program. We are currently interviewing for our fifth family. Our families all have unique stories, but share in the same struggle to have a place to call "home" and learn the skills necessary to become and remain self-sufficient. We currently have 15 mentors working with our families.

# Year End Giving

Advent is a time of preparation. The days ahead will seem to go by quickly as we decorate our homes, go shopping and attend the many gatherings that come with the holiday season. Yet, we encourage everyone to carve out time for quiet prayer and create a special place to welcome Jesus at Christmas.

Another way to prepare for the end of the year is through charitable giving. When we look back at the countless blessings many of us have received throughout the year, we hope that you will consider special ways to give back to the Lord for all He has given us. Please remember your spiritual home, Immaculate Conception, as well as our We are IC! Capital Campaign, as you discern your year-end gifts. For traditional monetary donations, contributions are deductible for tax purposes. Whether you are using offertory envelopes or taking advantage of the safe and convenient Online Giving program, proper credit will be reflected on your Parishioner statement. As a reminder, you can access the Online Giving program on the IC Parish website by clicking the orange "Donate Online" button on the left.

Following are a few alternatives to traditional donations for your consideration. Please know that any form of donation is humbly and greatly appreciated.

### Qualified Charitable Distributions

These typically include contributions from Donor Advised Funds, Required Minimum Distributions (RMD), or annuities. If you have an established Donor Advisor Fund or are contemplating creating one, please consider including Immaculate Conception as a charitable recipient of a donation from the fund. A Donor Advised Fund is administered by a third party for the primary purpose of managing contributions to charitable organizations, such as Immaculate Conception Parish.

Additionally, if you are age 70  $\frac{1}{2}$  or older, you can contact your IRA Fund Administrator and arrange for a tax-free direct transfer of your RMD to Immaculate Conception as a charitable donation. By doing a direct transfer from your IRA, the donation satisfies your required distribution yet does not increase your adjusted gross income for tax purposes.

### Stock Donation

For those who may own stocks, a review of your stock portfolio before year end maybe advantageous. For example, if you have stock(s) that may have decreased in value over the past years, you may want to consider donating this stock to Immaculate Conception Parish. The donation could be eligible for a charitable contribution tax deduction, but also may provide an offset to capital gains that you may have for this year. If stock has increased in value, you may be able to claim a deduction for the full fair market value and eliminate any tax on the appreciation.

### Employer Matching Gifts

Companies frequently match their employee's monetary contributions. If your employer has this type of program, please consider utilizing it on behalf of our Immaculate Conception Grade School or High School. Many corporations offer employee matching gift programs for educational institutions.

### Charitable Gifts from Your Will or Trust

An easy way to make a gift to Immaculate Conception is to include a bequest in your will or trust. You can give a specific sum, a percentage of your gross estate or your residuary estate.
