
# Pentecost Sunday Celebration

The members of all of the 16 parishes in the Eastern DuPage Deanery in the Diocese of Joliet are invited to join in the celebration of the coming of the Holy Spirit. The sacred Easter season officially comes to an end on the Solemnity of Pentecost, June 9. All of us are called to give witness to the presence of the Spirit in our lives. You are especially invited on this day to consider how you will show the guidance of the Holy Spirit in your life. Please consider making a difference, as we celebrate the birthday of the church, by the ways in which we proclaim that we are Christ's followers.

- \* Invite a friend or neighbor to come to church with you!
- \* Go out of your way to encourage someone to come to Mass that perhaps does not regularly attend!



We partner with the Elmhurst Walk-In Assistance Network (EWAN), a local not-for-profit formed in 1997 to respond to emergency needs in Elmhurst, IL. EWAN's mission statement reads, "The people of our faith communities, service organizations, businesses, and caring individuals unite in partnership to provide compassionate and effective assistance to people in need within our community."

For the first quarter of 2019, EWAN spent \$27,066 serving 213 clients, with 284 services provided (some clients needed assistance in multiple ways). Approximately 66% of EWAN's annual budget is used for rental assistance and utilities for those who are struggling. EWAN also vets clients who use the **IC food pantry**. Food pantry vouchers were given 179 times this quarter.

Our most needed items in the **Food Pantry** are brown and white rice, salad dressing, canned tuna and chicken, pasta and pasta sauce, canned or fresh fruit, coffee, milk, eggs, pancake mix and syrup, body soap/wash, toilet paper, shampoo, laundry detergent and dish soap. Cleaning items (sponges, Lysol, Clorox bleach, etc) are especially needed. Personal hygiene products are always welcome.

## The Shrine of Christ's Passion / Second Annual Trip St. John, Indiana



The Shrine of the Christ's Passion is a multi-media interactive, half-mile winding Prayer Trail that depicts the last days of Jesus Christ's life. Forty life-size bronze sculptures in a tranquil setting, complete with beautiful music and amazingly sculptured gardens allow visitors to experience the story of the crucifixion and resurrection as never before! We will also tour St. John the Evangelist Catholic Church, which borders the shrine.

### Reporting Sexual Abuse

The Victim Assistance Coordinator will report to Bishop Conlon and coordinate efforts of pastoral support and outreach to assist in the healing process. **World Refugee Sunday** is celebrated on June 20. In their encyclical "**Welcoming the Stranger Among Us: Unity in Diversity**," The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops call us to recognize the diverse gifts our brother and sister refugees and immigrants bring to the Church. We are highlighting portions of this letter and providing some facts on refugees.

- The presence of so many people of so many different cultures and religions in so many different parts of the United States has challenged us as a Church to profound conversion to that we can become truly a sacrament of unity.
- The new immigrants and refugees call us back to our ancestral heritage as descendants of immigrants and to our baptismal heritage as members of the Body of Christ.
- As Catholics we are called to take concrete measures to overcome the misunderstanding, ignorance, competition and fear that stand in the way of genuinely welcoming the stranger in our midst and enjoying the communion that is our destiny as Children of God.
- Immigrants, new to our shores, call us out of our unawareness to a conversion of mind and heart through which we are able to offer a genuine and suitable welcome, to share together as brothers and sisters at the same table, and to work side by side to improve the quality of life for society's marginalized members.
- The Church supports the human rights of all people and offers them pastoral care, education, and social services, no matter what the circumstances of entry into this country, and it works for the respect of the human dignity of all, especially those who find themselves in desperate circumstances.
- Racist attitudes can linger in subtle ways, even when people get to know one another, unless we vigorously educate ourselves about our neighbors, learn to appreciate their heritages, encounter their own images of us, and strive to work with them on behalf of common causes.
- The Church of the twenty-first century requires a profound conversion in spirit and in its institutions to reflect its own cultural pluralism, to address the needs of the whole Catholic community, and to further a genuine communion of solidarity among the diverse members of the Body of Christ.

### FACTS ABOUT REFUGEES

- A refugee is a person who has been forced to leave his/her homeland and is unable to return because she or he has experienced persecution or has a well-founded fear of persecution. Persecution can be related to race, nationality, religion, political opinions, or membership in a particular social group.
- There are 22.5 million refugees around the world, with 55 percent from just three countries: Syria, Afghanistan and South Sudan.
- Over 50 percent of refugees are under the age of 18.
- Every minute, 20 people are forced to flee their homes due to conflict and persecution.
- Most refugees wait an average of 17 years in a refugee camp or in urban areas outside the camps before returning to their country or resettling in a new country.
- Less than 1 percent of the world's refugees are ever resettled to a new country.
- Turkey is the top hosting country for refugees with a total of 2.9 million.
- The vetting process that allows for refugees to be resettled in the United States is conducted by both the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) and the United States government, taking up to 2 years and oftentimes longer.
- Since 1975, the U.S. government has welcomed over 3 million refugees for resettlement and these refugees have since built new lives and homes in all 50 states.
- In the fiscal year 2017, Illinois was the ninth top state for refugee resettlement.


## **Totus Tuus at Visitation Parish July 14-19**


