It is not until June 9th when we celebrate the great Feast of Pentecost that the Easter Season will come to an end. Dear Friends in Christ,

This May article is part 4 of a 4 part series on the **P.R.AYER. Diet**. This month I will cover **AYER**. Once again, if you have read the other articles, what I'm about to say will be familiar, but I'm not a trained medical professional or doctor. I'm trying to hand on what I've heard and/or read about, and to share what has worked for me.

AYER = And You Eating Right

So we have covered Prayer and Recreation, but as I ended last month's article, "so if I pray about it and move, I'll lose weight?! Well.....it helps, but one more key thing...the last part of the acronym...". I spent one summer in Omaha, NE at the Institute for Priestly Formation back when I was in the seminary. While I was at the Institute, I met a seminarian from the Archdiocese of Galveston / Houston. Before he entered the seminary, he was either a personal trainer or a nutritionist. Regardless, what he shared with me one day was something along the lines of, "people used to pay me hundreds of dollars for this advice...its 70 -80% diet..." I personally have come to experience this as true! When I have had the most success with my weight loss, it has been in conjunction with my diet being carefully monitored as well.

There was a news article I came across a number of weeks back, and it put the above advice in perspective for me. The article talked about how 20-30% of the calories we burn come from exercise. The rest that we burn come from automatic bodily functions like brain activity and breathing. So basically, we can only control 20-30% of what we burn, but the food we eat, what we take in, that we have 100% control of. Thus, the importance of diet. That yes, we can put hours and hours in the gym (and yes exercise is important), but that only accounts for a small percentage of what we burn. But what food we take in, that we have complete control over, and there are definitely things that are better to take in than others.

So we have 100% control over what we take in, so do we have to eat 100% clean 100% of the time for this to work? I answer no. That is almost impossible, at least for me. But we can make various choices that if they become a habit, they lead to successful weight loss. Take an example. In information I've come across, a pound is 3,500 calories. So if we want to lose a pound, we need a 3,500 calorie deficit. This means we need to have burned 3,500 more calories than we took in. This can be done by exercise, or watching how many calories we take in, or a combination of both.

Say we drink a large sized coffee drink with whole milk and syrups every day that adds up to 500 calories a drink. If we cut that out of our diet, in theory that's 3,500 calories for the week out of our diet right there. Keeping everything else the same (diet and exercise), this should contribute to weight loss, assuming we are not taking in more calories than we are burning through other food and drink. When we do that, the opposite happens, weight gain.

But that coffee drink is delicious. Well we can still have it! Maybe not every day, but once in a while or every other day. Or maybe get it with half the syrup. Little changes like that add up. Say we get that drink down to 250 calories versus 500. That's only 1,750 calories instead of 3,500 for the week. Do that for a year, that's 91,000 calories we saved in a year, all because of some changes or maybe switching to every other day. To make these changes takes virtue. It takes the ability to say **NO**. Not always the easiest thing. But there is more than just health benefits that can come from saying no and making certain diet choices. It helps us spiritually too. I believe it was St. Augustine who talks about if we can't say no to smaller things, how can we say no to bigger things? Saying no to a dessert, or saying no to an extra helping of something helps build up our wills. Thus, as a result of saying no to smaller things, when a larger thing we need to say no to comes along, we have a better ability to do it, because our will is trained.

I could keep going on and on about the AYER. part of the of the P.R.AYER. Diet. The main take away I would like to share is the big role our diet plays in weight loss. Making little changes to our diet adds up over time. On top of that, not only do little changes help our health, but they can help strengthen our wills too. I'll also share here a couple things practically I have done / do in my diet, that work for me:

- -I try and watch my carb intake. I still eat some carbs, but I try to limit how many carbs I take in. I really don't limit carbs from fruits and vegetables, however.
- -I try to not consume added sugar when I can avoid it. (I need my "Father Chris Solo" drink from Brewpoint, from time to time, however! #tryit #highlyrecommend)
- -I try and eat things that are high in protein.
- -I usually won't eat desserts or sweets.
- -I try to not drink my calories.

My hope is that these 4 articles have been helpful. Please feel free to ask me if you have any questions. I'm always happy to talk about this stuff! Remember, no matter what size, shape, weight, etc. a person is, we are ALL beloved sons and daughters of God! We are all loved, and our bodies don't define us. Our bodies are Temples of the Holy Spirit and we need to be responsible for them, but they don't "make" us who we are.

While in the Holy Land it was a joy to pray for each of you, as I brought the parish directory with me on the pilgrimage. Know that those prayers continue!




## IC Catholic Prep to celebrate retirees Pam Levar and Cindy Thomas


## **Totus Tuus at Visitation Parish July 14-19**
